Contents: Globalization, economic crises, unemployment and increasing poverty have prompted many workers in low income countries to seek work out of their country of origin, particularly in low-skilled-labor. There are close to 232 million migrants (3,1% of global population), women make up almost half of them. Working and employment conditions are precarious and lack social protection, facing many of the inequalities of the labor markets (highly vulnerabl&e to exploitation, slavery and human trafficking). Challenges migrant women workers face (most in service sector, gender segregation) will be addressed. Programs from to protect and ensure adequate protection for these workers will be discussed.
