





# Seoul Statement on the Development of Occupational Health Services for All

#### Seoul Statement on the Development of Occupational Health Services for All

The 31<sup>th</sup> International Congress on Occupational Health, ICOH 2015, was organized by the International Commission on Occupational Health, ICOH, the Korea Occupational Safety and Health Agency, KOSHA, and the Korean Society on Occupational and Environmental Medicine, SKOEM, from 31 May to 5 Inee 2015 in Seoul, Republic of Korea. The Congress approved a "Seoul Statement on the Development of Occupational Health Services for AI".

#### Recalling

that deemt conditions of work, occupational health and occupational safety constitute a basic human right of workers as declared by the UN International Covenant on Economic, Social and Caltural Rights of working people (1966), the ILD Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work (1998), the Centenial Declaration of the International Commission on Occupational Health, ICDH (2006) and the Secul Declaration on Safety and Health at Work adopted by the ILD, ISSA, KOSHA and ICOH together with a high number of other Non-Governmental and Professional Associations (2008),

#### Emphasizing

that in spite of positive developments of occupational safety and health particularly in industrialized countries, over three quarters of workers: of the world live and work in developing and transitory countries, often working in high risk occupations in both formal actional sectors, without adequate protection by occupational health and safety law and lacking social protection and access to occupational health services. Such apps in prevention and protection lead to 23 million deaths among the workers of the world every year,

#### Keeping in mind

that the ILO Convention No. 161 on Occupational Health Services and the WHO Global Strategy on Occupational Health for All, as well as the Cancen Charter by the ICOII (2012), call for organization of occupational health services for all working individuals and all occupations, without exclusion of any group of workers, economic sectors, including the informal sector, or workers in contracted or self-employment.

#### Taking into consideration

that new challenges, risks and hazards continuously emerge, due to changes in economic structures, transfer of technologies, demographic changes, migration and social dynamics. The management of and adjustment to the continuous change need active sharing of information, the effective use of existing knowledges. and the generation of new research on occurational health.

#### Recognizing

that a growing body of research evidence speaks for positive economic and productivity impact of occupational health services, due to prevention of loss by accidents and diseases, sickness absenteeism and disabilities, and through facilitation of production processes,

#### Reminding

that according to the principles of the ICOH International Code of Ethics for Occupational Health Professionals, protection and promotion of workers' health is a professional, ethical and social imperative for all occupational health professionals and for the international accupational health community.

the 31st ICOH Congress states the following:

#### 1. Policies

Every government in collaboration with social partners should, as a part of their stewardship, draw up necessary regulations, strategies and programmes for antional policies on occupational hoshib, and eccupational Health Strives and the WHO Global Strategy on Occupational Health for LU Convention No. 161, Recommendation No. 171 on Occupational Health Strives and the WHO Global Strategy on Occupational Health for All. Such policy should aim at the provision of services for all, with full (overage without exclusion of any group or sector of work life.

#### 2. Implementation

Implementation of occupational health policies should be based on legislation, with appropriate governance structures, well-defined rights and responsibilities, estabilishment and strengthening of the occupational health system and respective infrastructures, and sufficient resources and financing for services. Special mesaures, multiple service provision models, including primary health care, and support should be developed for organization of occupational health services for small-scale enterprises, the self-employed and the informal sectors. Public occupational health services should be provided for the underserved sectors. Where front-line services are of limited scope, usually occupational health services for small, they should be reinforced by secondary level support services.

#### 3. Content and activities

The content and activities of occupational health services at the workplace level include prevention and management of physical, chemical, biological and ergonomic factors, prevention of occupational diseases and injuries, prevention of excessive work load, and work life constraints, promotion of health and work ability, rehabilitation and return to work, as well as first ad and curative services. Such services should be adjusted to the health needs of working people, by taking into consideration the existing hazards and responding to the needs of various groups of workers, including young, female, aging and migrant workers and various types of vulnerable groups.

New Avenues for Prevention of Occupational Cancer and Other Severe Occupational Health Hazards

#### Preamble

The 32<sup>nd</sup> International Congress on Occupational Health, ICOH 2018, was organized by the International Commission on Occupational Health, ICOH and the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, Faculty of Occupational Medicine, in Dublin on 29 April–4 May 2018.

#### Recalling

- the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, particularly Sustainable Development Goals Nos. 1, 3, and 8;
- the 66<sup>th</sup> UN General Assembly Resolution 16 September 2011 Political declaration of the High-level Meeting of the General Assembly on the Prevention and Control of Noncommunicable Diseases;
- o the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, adopted by the 86<sup>th</sup> International Labour Conference on 15 June 2010; ILO Conventions No. 155 of 1981 and No. 187 of 2006 on Occupational Safety and Health and Convention No. 161 on Occupational Health Services of 1985, ILO Asbestos Convention No. 162 of 1986, Occupational Cancer Convention No. 139 of 1974 and the ILO Resolution of 1 June 2006 concerning asbestos; and




## **Geographical distribution**

### Dec 31, 2002




### **Geographical distribution - GDP per capita**
