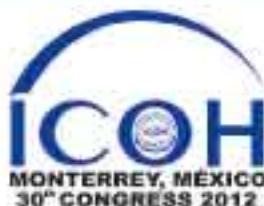

International Commission on Occupational Health (ICOH)

Founded in 1906

An International Professional Organization



The International Commission on Occupational Health (ICOH) is an international professional organization dedicated to scientific research, knowledge, and development of occupational health and safety.

It was founded in 1906 in Milan, Italy as the Permanent Commission on Occupational Health. Today ICOH has over 2,000 members in 94 countries. ICOH is recognized by the United Nations as a non-governmental organization and has a close working relationship with the International Labour Organization, World Health Organization, International Social Security Association, International Ergonomics Association (IEA), and International Occupational Hygiene Association (IOHA). Its official languages are English and French.

ICOH activities

The main activities of ICOH are research, training, information and development of good practices in occupational health. Providing guidance for professional ethics is a special and prominent activity of ICOH and the *International Code of Ethics for Occupational Health Professionals* is a widely used guideline among the occupational health experts throughout the world.

ICOH World Congresses

The most visible activity of ICOH is the triennial World Congresses on Occupational Health, which are usually attended by some 3,000 participants. The 1993 Congress was held in Nice (France), the 1996 Congress in Stockholm (Sweden), the 2000 Congress in Singapore, the 2003 Congress in Iguassu Falls (Brazil) and the 2006 Centennial Congress in Milan (Italy). The venue of the 2009 Congress is Cape Town (South Africa). ICOH 2012 will be held in Monterrey (Mexico).

Scientific Committees

ICOH has 34 Scientific Committees and one Network. They cover a broad scope of challenges and problems in work life, including traditional risks of occupational injuries and diseases, and the risks of "new work life". The Scientific Committees focus specifically on their areas of competence and promote and carry out research in their respective fields. Most of these committees have regular symposia, publish scientific monographs and review the abstracts submitted to the World Congresses.

In addition to Scientific Committees, ICOH appoints specific Working Groups for highly topical themes: the Working Group for Biological Agents and Infectious Diseases, the Working Group on Child Labour, the Working Group on Occupational Medicine and the Working Group on Professional Curricula.

Membership

ICOH has both individual and collective members. An organization, society, or enterprise may become a sustaining member of ICOH. A professional organization or a scientific society may become an affiliate member. ICOH's individual members have a wide professional distribution.

Benefits for ICOH members

- Substantial reduction of the registration fee of the triennial International Congresses and some other ICOH-sponsored conferences.
- Reductions of the subscription rates of international scientific journals (20-30%), in the price of all ILO publications (50%) and WHO information products (40%).
- Participation in the activities of up to three of the 34 scientific committees and any of the two scientific networks, as well as an opportunity to submit materials for publication in the ICOH Newsletter.
